

**THE LICENSING ACT 2003 (PREMISES LICENCES AND CLUB PREMISES
CERTIFICATES) REGULATIONS 2005**
Regulation 25 Advertisement

TO : WHOM IT MAY CONCERN

We, The Salt Room Limited, do hereby give notice that it is our intention to apply to Brighton & Hove City Council for the variation of a premises licence or club premises certificate to use or permit the use of premises known as:- ***The Salt Room 106 Kings Road, Brighton and Hove, Brighton BN1 2FU***

for the following licensable activities/ proposed variation which it is proposed will be carried on, on or from the premises:

Provide an updated premises plan at Annex 4.

Vary conditions 2, 3 and 4 of the current conditions within Annex 2 of the licence to read:

2. The service of alcohol shall be:

(a) by waiter/waitress service only to customers seated at tables, and

(b) ancillary to a table meal,

These restrictions shall not apply:

- Within the indoor terrace room**
- During pre-booked, ticketed events or private hire events, where alcohol may be served without the requirement for a table meal.**

For the avoidance of doubt, during such events, alcohol may be served by waiter/waitress service and/or by bar staff.

3. In the hatched area on the floor plan the sale of alcohol will be by way of waiter/waitress service to customers seated at tables or to customers seated at chairs or bar stalls at the bar or to persons standing in this area (where

the service of alcohol may be made by bar staff behind the bar).

4. REMOVE THIS CONDITION

Any person who desires to make a representation to the **variation**, should send to EHL.licensing@brighton-hove.gov.uk or Regulatory Services Manager, Regulatory Services, Environmental Health and Licensing, Bartholomew House, Bartholomew Square, Brighton, BN1 1JP no later than midnight on the 16th May 2026 a brief written statement of the grounds of his/her objection. The register and records of applications may be viewed at the above council office during normal office hours; summaries are available via www.brighton-hove.gov.uk/licensing.

It is an offence knowingly or recklessly to make a false statement in connection with an application, the maximum penalty for which a person is liable on summary conviction is an unlimited fine.
